Are you a member of the Florida LGBTA Democratic Caucus? No

Do you identify as LGBT? I identify as an ally.

Are you a member of the Broward Democratic Executive Committee? Yes

Would you condemn instances of hate speech in your district? Yes and I always have.

Do you believe that a woman has the right to terminate her unwanted pregnancy? Please Explain. Yes, I fundamentally believe in a woman's right to control her own body and determine whether or not she chooses to be pregnant.

Have you ever registered to participate in a LGBT Pride parade (e.g. The Wilton Manors Stonewall Pride Parade)? If so, how many, when were they, and where were they held? I have walked in two pride parades as an elected official although I cannot remember which years. Prior to that, I attended a couple times as a supportive spectator.

Do you <u>support</u> legislation that would require background checks for all gun purchases? Yes!

Do you believe it should be illegal for anyone on the No-Fly list to purchase a gun? Yes!

Would you <u>support</u> a policy that lease and event contracts include a prohibition that assault weapons may not be sold on your municipalities' property at any event?

Would you <u>support</u> non-discrimination legislation that would make it illegal to fire someone and/or deny them housing because of their sexual orientation or gender identity and expression? Yes!

Would you <u>support</u> legislation to ban 'conversion therapy', a range of dangerous and discredited practices that falsely claim to change a person's sexual orientation or gender identity or expression? Yes!

Would you <u>support</u> legislation requiring fair and equal access to essential healthcare for transgender persons?

Would you <u>support</u> efforts in our public schools to provide HIV/STI prevention education? Yes!

Yes! AFSCME has endorsed me and offered their full support. I also support a \$15 minimum wage. My opponent has voted against the budget funding cost of living adjustments to employees' salaries.

Do you <u>support</u> contracts that require competitive bidding also require the contractor to provide a living wage and healthcare benefits to all its employees doing work for your municipality?

Do you <u>support</u> requiring municipal contractors to provide a minimum of two weeks paid vacation to their employees who are doing work for your municipality?

Yes! And I voted in support of subsidized after school care programs. My opponent has voted against the budget funding these programs.

Do you support after school and sports programs being offered by your municipality?

Yes! And I voted in support of funding these programs while in office. My opponent has voted against the budget funding these programs.

Do you <u>support</u> legislation requiring healthy food options at day care facilities and municipal after school/sports programs?

Yes! I've also supported "healthier" vending machine options.

Do you <u>support</u> the right of the people to demonstrate peacefully in your municipality without complicated permits being required?

I was recruited to run because of my history of progressive policies and ability to solve discrepancies in a positive light. I'll work to complete our city wide parks plans, revamp our affordable housing policies and fight for new roadways and more mass transit to reduce traffic. When I met Army Lt. Dan Choi, at a Young Elected Officials meeting, it validated my long held belief that even though I'm not LGBT myself, I can be part of the LGBT community. I have a personal stake in the fight for equality. After all, if the LGBT community doesn't have equality then by definition, neither do I. I haven't just spoken about equality; I stepped up and acted to bring us one step closer to it.

Lewy stressed his social liberalism, including expanding rights for gay Floridians.

Our Legislature needs someone who has a proven track record of standing up for social justice and equality, said Lewy. I was proud to champion an historic first-in-the-nation initiative to bring tax equity to our domestic partner employees in Hallandale Beach. Social justice is a deep seated value my parents bestowed in me at an early age. Equal pay for equal work, livable wages and individual rights are not talking points or bargaining tools. They are the fundamental principles of freedom and justice this nation was founded on.

Hallandale Beach is believed to be the first in the state to enact a policy that seeks to offset the taxes assessed on the cost of providing domestic partnership health benefits, which the federal government treats as income.

"Hallandale is one of the first cities in the country to pass [a reimbursement policy]. It may be the only city," Pollitzer said. "It's definitely cutting edge."

The city estimates employees with domestic partner health coverage pay an average of \$940 more in taxes each year as a result of the coverage. The city currently has five employees receiving such coverage, which will bring the cost of the reimbursement program to \$2,500 annually.

"The more local support we have for tax equity and fairness for all our employees, the easier it will be to change federal law," said Hallandale Beach Commissioner Alex Lewy, who suggested the reimbursement after learning about the issue at a Washington conference earlier this year for elected officials. "I really want this to go beyond Hallandale Beach."
